

Results

- The Masterplan Framework sets out a forward-looking vision for Accrington, building on the town's current strengths and untapped potential. It outlines new sites for development, promotes more effective use of existing buildings and spaces, diversifies the range of activities within the town centre, and highlights opportunities to enhance and introduce high-quality public spaces aiming to create a more vibrant and inclusive town centre for everyone to benefit.
- The proposals present a broad range of opportunities to celebrate and enhance the town's remaining heritage. They aim to strengthen connections between the town centre and its natural surroundings—visually and physically—by linking to the surrounding hillsides and exploring options for deculverting and improving engagement with the watercourses that flow through the heart of the town.
- The Accrington Town Centre Masterplan Framework was adopted by Hyndburn Borough Council as an Area Action Plan in March 2025.
